From
*Pastor
Devon*

When I was a kid, Easter always felt like an exciting day. My mom was the church accompanist and the choir always sang a cantata, which she practiced tirelessly in our living room. It also meant a short sermon, which was never a bad thing. It was one of the few

Sundays my Dad would join us for church and we would sing hymns that had been ingrained in my soul: "Christ the Lord is Risen Today," and "Up from the Grave He Arose." Do you know those hymns? For me, Easter meant a fancy new dress wearing my little patent leather shoes that shined, hunting for eggs and other little gifts, and chocolate (still my favorite part!) When I was in seminary, I served as the pastor for youth and small children at a small church in Georgia. Because it was warmer there, we did our Easter Egg hunts outside. For the teenagers that meant a night-time hunt, using flashlights. It was a blast, but what I had not counted on were the presence of hundreds of little slugs that had just spring to life. That was kind of grow! It was a memory I won't forget. What memories do you have of Easter?

I suppose some of the excitement of Easter is due to the nature of what comes before it: the Last Supper, the Garden of Gethsemane, Peter's denial, and the cross. We can't fully celebrate the power of resurrection unless we also know the depth of grief, loss, and fear that comes with death. Resurrection means that we can be people of hope even in the hardest, darkest times because we know that there is more to the story. When it feels like we are surrounded by difficult circumstance, often hope, the promise of resurrection, can be found in our connection to our faith community. My prayer for us the Lent/Easter season is that as we begin to see the signs of spring and the promise of new life and renewal around us, our Spirits may also be renewed and strengthened as we journey together. Let's keep our eyes, ears, minds, and hearts open to the presence of resurrection and the power of hope.




Pastor Devon's Contact Information

APRIL IS CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION & AWARENESS MONTH

April is recognized as Child Abuse Prevention Month. In recognition of the Month, church members and members of the broader community are asked to **wear blue on National Wear Blue day on April 4**. As part of the monthly awareness activities, the Meceola Children's Council is sponsoring a 5K run/walk on Saturday, April 26.

The last Sunday in April is recognized throughout the world as **Blue Sunday**. On that Sunday, we are asked to pray for victims of abuse that they will be rescued; that they are placed with caring people; that their minds and bodies can heal; that they find hope; and pray for those who rescue them. Church members will be provided with a blue ribbon as they enter the sanctuary on **April 27** to wear in recognition of Blue Sunday. We all need to extend our loving hearts and care for these children of God.





ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

In Isaiah 58, the prophet exclaims, "Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in" (Isaiah 58:12). 
