

Mac and cheese is being collected for July. An update will be provided next month but the bin is filling and the generosity continues!

And the "Give to the Pantry" program has identified **<u>elbow</u>** noodles as the "food of the month" for August. Elbow noodles are a staple that every family gets with an order. So as demand increases, so does the need.
