



MAY IS MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

May is Mental Health Awareness Month, an annual observance established by Mental Health America in 1949 to emphasize the importance of mental wellbeing. Each May, additional attention is brought to the challenges faced by those with mental health conditions and the need for a supportive, understanding environment. Across the country, people unite to raise awareness, spark conversations and advocate for improved resources.

Despite recent strides in how our society approaches mental wellbeing, many Americans still don't have access to the high-quality, comprehensive treatment and care they need. Just take a look at some of the staggering data about mental health in the United States:

- 1 in 5 U.S. adults experience mental illness each year.
- Only 47.2% of U.S. adults with mental illness received treatment in 2021.
- 1 in 6 U.S. youth have a mental health condition, but only half receive treatment.
- 50% of all lifetime mental illness begins by age 14, and 75% by age 24.

And locally the New Journey Clubhouse, 405B South Third Ave., Big Rapids, is a place where people who qualify can become part of a community intentionally organized to support individuals living with the effects of mental illness. It's a place where opportunities are given to rejoin the worlds of friendships, family, work, education and to access the service and supports someone may need during hard times.

"Recovery is not a cure; it's the life you want to live," Sue Stewart, clubhouse director for New Journey Clubhouse, said. "A lot of people don't get help because they're isolated."


We are also grateful for the Spiritual Life Commission for all they do to make our worship meaningful each Sunday.
